
If you're looking for inspiration for how to get started with your fundraising, here are lots of cool ideas!

Planning & Promoting Your Event

Once you've chosen your fundraising idea, the next step is to think about how you will plan your event.



The Why

Make it personal. Explain what your event is and what the Erb's Palsy Group means to you. Provide regular updates about how you are getting on - people will be keen to sponsor you if they know you are putting effort in. People who use a photo raise 53% more than those who don't, so make sure to take lots of photos.

Target

How much are you aiming to raise? People who set a fundraising target raise on average 40% more than those who don't. Make sure your target is clear and people will want to help you achieve it. Don't stop once you hit your target; if you can, keep going and see how much more money you can raise.



The Big Build Up

It's really important you let people know about your fundraising campaign and when you plan to do it so they can help spread the word!

Consider the following:

- Posting on your personal social media channels to let people know well in advance what your plans are
- Let people know how they can support you through donations send them your Just Giving page so they can make a donation really easily!
- Use our free social media materials (included in this free fundraising pack) to help promote your fundraising on social media.
 - Would the local press be interested in your fundraising mission? Why not get in touch with them before you start your campaign and see if they'll cover it! Try local radio, newspapers, local social media channels, websites, magazines and newsletters.

Promote it

Sharing your fundraiser is really important. It helps to spread the word, find new supporters and raise awareness of the Erb's Palsy Group.

Social media is often the quickest way to share your fundraiser and to keep people updated.

Through promotion, you will likely find more people willing to donate or attend your event. By posting regular updates you will keep the momentum going and increase the number of donations.

Legalities

Third Party Data

During your fundraising efforts, it is possible that you will handle personal data belonging to individuals associated with your activities. It is your responsibility to ensure that any paper or electronic data you possess adheres to the regulations set forth by the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). Safeguarding the data you have stored is of utmost importance to prevent loss or damage. Furthermore, it is essential to only retain data for as long as necessary and refrain from sharing someone's information without their explicit consent.

Liability

Please ensure that it is explicitly stated that your fundraising efforts are conducted "in aid of" the Erb's Palsy Group. This signifies that you are solely responsible for organising all aspects of your fundraising activity, and the Erb's Palsy Group will not assume any liability associated with your fundraising endeavours. Additionally, please note that the Erb's Palsy Group will not cover any expenses or costs incurred during "in aid of" fundraisers. If you are planning an event, it is essential for you to conduct the necessary risk assessments and prioritise the health and safety of all participants.

Raffles & Lotteries

Hosting a raffle or lottery can be an effective method to raise funds while keeping costs low. However, it's crucial to adhere to the strict regulations surrounding such activities (please refer to the Gambling Commission for detailed information). We strongly advise that you familiarise yourself with these regulations and conduct your auction, lottery, or raffle accordingly. It's important to note that licenses are mandatory for all online auctions. As a responsible charity, we are obligated to provide this guidance. However, should you decide to proceed with a different type of raffle, it becomes your sole responsibility, and we cannot be held liable for any actions taken by the Gambling License Regulators.

Ethical Fundraising

The Erb's Palsy Group has a responsibility to safeguard the charity's reputation, mission, and the well-being of its beneficiaries. It is imperative that fundraising activities align with our ethical standards. Therefore, we kindly request that donations stemming from the production of weapons, tobacco, or alcohol brands not be accepted. Terms and Conditions
